	It is their intention to have a police rep. attend our meetings, if not our community constable then one from a neighbouring area.			
	There were 31 calls for Ferryden last month, compared with 666 for Montrose. Angus does have a very low crime rate.			
	An EU initiative brought in 20mph limits and zones, without consultation with Police Scotland. Police will enforce in high risk areas eg schools & accident black spots.			
	Flashing signs calculate vehicles going over 20mph, and AC are happy with readings in our ward.			
	Cut out policeman can be purchased if speeding is an issue and works well in other areas.			
	Parking is enforced by AC unless obstructing driveways or pavements (prams, wheelchairs etc).			
	Parking at bottom of Usan Road causing difficulties for other road users (HGV's & Tractors) was raised and will be passed to Sgt Tracy Brown to check if a police issue.			
	Calls do not go directly to local police, and are triaged at a call centre. If your concern is urgent and/or persistent please keep calling and reporting to force action.
