CHRISTMAS CONCERT

We held a very successful whole school concert, called "Children of the World." Each class share a different country's Christmas traditions and a Christmas song related to the country.

CINEMA TRIP

Primaries 1 to 7 went to The Montrose Playhouse to watch "The Nightmare Before Christmas." The film and popcorn were kindly paid for by Montrose Port Authority.

COMMUNITY CAFE

The final cafe of 2025 was held on the 11th of December. This café was run by Primary 6. Mrs Minty and her skills group sold Christmas gifts that they had made. The money raised by the skills group and the money donated at the café will be used to help purchase a community shed. This shed will be used to store a school uniform bank and to share food donations made by supermarkets. The shed will allow more families easy access to these needed resources. Mrs Minty is looking to find funding for the final amount needed.

SCHOOL STAFF

Our head teacher, Miss Mackay, is currently undertaking a different role in the council. She is a quality improvement officer and a leader of learning. While she is doing this job, Mrs Jones is acting head teacher and we welcome Mrs Siegert as acting deputy head teacher.

SENSORY POD

We are excitedly awaiting the delivery of a new sensory pod for Ferryden Primary School. A parent began fundraising for this and we will welcome her and her son to cut the ribbon to officially open the pod.

JUNIOR COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Two pupils from primary 6 are now members of the Montrose Junior Community Council. The girls have attended meetings and shared ideas on how to make the town a better place for the children living here. Their current project, is how they can improve play resources in the local parks.

YOUNG LEADERS OF LEARNING

Ferryden Primary School has five young leaders of learning. Ferryden has been paired with Southmuir Primary School. The young leaders will visit Southmuir on Friday to see around and compare resources etc. Southmuir pupils will then visit Ferryden.
